LMSA Faculty Spotlight

MEET DR. JOSE LEZAMA



Jose "Joe" Lezama Jr, MD MACP is a Tampa native, completed his training in Internal Medicine at the University of South Florida, College of Medicine after medical school graduation from the UF College of Medicine. Dr. Lezama joined the University of South Florida Internal Medicine Faculty after residency completion, as well as the James Haley Veterans Hospital in July 2000. He was appointed Chief of Medicine in February 2006 as one of the youngest physicians in the history of the Veterans Health Administration and only the 3rd active Latino/Latina Chief of Medicine in the country at the time. He was promoted to Associate Chair of the USF Department of Internal Medicine in 2006 at the time of his promotion to Associate Professor of Medicine. He was named Vice Chair of Education and promoted to Professor of Medicine in 2012.

Dr. Lezama is a five-time recipient of the John T. Sinnott Award and the Osler Award for best clinical teacher and best exemplary role model for the USF Morsani College of Medicine and winning multiple other College of Medicine awards, including the Leonard Tow Humanism Award. He was recognized as the Top Medical Educator of the State of Florida by the American College of Physicians in 2004 and was honored as one of the top 40 physicians for Humanism in Medicine by the AAMC in 2008. He received the Department of Internal Medicine's Teacher of the Year award seven times in his career. He received recognition as one of the top 10 Internal Medicine Hospitalist Physicians by the American College of Physicians (ACP) in 2010 as the first ever Hispanic physician recognized by the ACP.

He has served the Florida ACP's Governor's Council for the past 22 years. The University of Florida recognized Dr. Lezama accomplishments by induction into the University of Florida-College of Medicine Wall of Fame, becoming only the 40th physician recognize with this honor in the 70-year history of the UF College of Medicine and the FIRST Latino/Latina physician to be recognized on the UF College of Medicine Wall of Fame. He was further honored by the Laureate Award by the National American College of Physicians selection committee in 2021 (only the second Latino/Latina physician in the history of Florida ACP) and then elected to Mastership level of the American College of Physicians in 2023 which are two of the highest distinctions which can be received by a member of the American College of Physicians.

His research interests include transitions of care hospital and ER programs, artificial intelligence hospital mortality predictive models, and access of care for vulnerable patient populations such as traumatic brain injury patients. His first full length solo authored book on methodology to learn and to teach internal medicine in three years of residency will be released this July.

Dr. Lezama first generation Cuban-American, his parents came on the Pedro Pan flights from Cuba as teenagers. He was born at Tampa General Hospital and went to St Lawrence Catholic School and Tampa Jesuit. He currently lives in Lutz, Fl and has been married for 22 years with three children. He hopes to have the opportunity to engage with Latino/Latina medical students through the LMSA and speak about the need to start developing leadership skills early in medical school in order to be ready to take on positions of higher authority as he did only eight years after graduating medical school.

His message to Latino/Latina medical students is the following: Never ever stop believing in yourself or your talents. Use the love of your Hispanic heritage to promote the success of those younger Latino/Latina medical students and college students who already look up to you, and never ever take a statement of "it will be a hard road" or "that is a path that not many Latino/Latina students take" for anything more than "fighting words" to inspire you to reach even greater heights than you ever imagined for yourself. I myself have been guilty at times of underselling my talents and my achievements given I have not had many Latino/Latina mentors on a national level. Always believe in yourself and your talents and never forget the richness of your Hispanic heritage that fills you with the grit and the resiliency to always succeed.
