MEET DR. KARLA MORA RODRIGUEZ



Dr. Karla Mora Rodriguez is a third year Neurology Resident at the University of South Florida. She is part of the USF Patient Safety Council Committee at Tampa General Hospital. She completed her medical degree, as well as her first neurology residency at the University of Costa Rica, in her home country. Subsequently, she completed an International Fellowship in Clinical Neurophysiology and Epilepsy at Medical University of South Carolina in Charleston. She is now completing an ACGME accredited neurology training and wishes to practice epilepsy thereafter. Aside from her activities related to patient care, she is interested in academics and clinical research. She has contributed to various research projects, poster presentations and scholarly activities throughout her career. These include clinical trials (CREAD 1-2), presentations in the American Epilepsy Society, American Academy of Neurology and American Clinical Neurophysiology Society, and individual projects that culminated in manuscripts such as "Managing Antiepileptic Medication in Dialysis Patients" and "Quality Improvement Study in Epilepsy Patients Treated with Epidiolex". Additionally, she was selected for participation in the House Staff Emerging Academy of Leaders (HEAL) for Underrepresented Groups Program for the commitment to academic medicine, leadership development and professional development at UTSW from 2021-2022. She wishes to continue to represent the Latino community professionally as a physician and educator, and to improve the quality of medical care for people of these underrepresented minorities. "It is not how much you work, but how passionate you are about what you do. The desire to be better for your patients, as well as compassion and empathy are qualities that can set you apart from others. I believe these virtues will make you exceptional as a physician and as a human being."
