# LMSA Faculty Spotlight

#### MEET DR. ALFREDO ORTEGA COTTE



Dr. Alfredo Ortega Cotte is a first-year Internal Medicine resident at the University of South Florida. He provides inpatient care at Tampa General Hospital, Moffit Cancer Center, and the James Haley VA. He also serves a predominantly low income and Spanish speaking patient population at TGH HealthPark. He completed his Bachelor of Science at the University of South Florida in 2019. Shortly after graduation, he worked as an ER Tech at Plantation General Hospital, Broward County, during the start of the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020. Later that same year he started medical school at the USF Morsani College of Medicine (MCOM) where he served as Class President. Throughout his medical journey, he served as a healthcare volunteer and Junior Faculty in two medical mission trips to the Dominican Republic, where he provided primary care services to rural underserved areas and Haitian refugee camps. He also served as President of the International Health Service Collaborative at MCOM, where he led a pilot service trip of interdisciplinary health teams to Medellin, Colombia, and provided medical services to the poorest urban district of the city in collaboration with Universidad CES.

His areas of research and publications have focused on understanding the impact of COVID-19 and pandemic policies among Spanish and Arabic speaking refugees in the city of Tampa. His work was presented during the annual Refugee Task Force of Southwest Florida meeting, which allowed key interventions and aid of refugees in the region at the height of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Dr. Ortega Cotte was born and raised in Colombia, where he spent most of his childhood before moving to Florida at the age of 12. His biggest professional milestone has been surviving colon cancer for the sole reason that it taught him a career lesson, through the eyes of being a patient, not found on any medical book or peer-reviewed journal: "sometimes the best medication to give is Kindness q daily, and its does not require a medical degree." His career goals are to become a Hospitalist with a focus on International Medicine and Global Health. He hopes to continue to work with LMSA at USF to mentor any Latino/Latina medical student through the challenges of being an underrepresented member of the medical community. His biggest message to Latino/Latina medical students is: "Be proud of your Hispanic heritage because the medical community needs us more than ever. We are in high demand and a MUST for hospitals to have. And do not forget to use our beautiful language, strong interpersonal values, warm approach, cheerful music, diverse cultural traditions, and matchless food to connect with all our patients, especially our large Hispanic patient population. At the end of the day, a los latinos nos gusta que nuestros doctores nos hagan sentir en casa".


# Faculty Mentors
